

Common Abortion Arguments & Questions

True- abortion is LEGAL. However, legalizing murder of a human child isn't moral. It really is time to protect the next generation. We need to start with the argument- Let's define what is the woman pregnant with, it's not a fish, dog, cat... then once we define that which we know, we need to ask **SHOULD WE BE KILLING IT.** This is where we should start the public debate

1. **Personhood-isn't defined by size, location, development, or ability.**
2. **My body, my choice**-we know by science that at conception a new DNA string is created, the baby is a separate life & body from the mom. The unborn baby is not part of the woman's body, like her tonsils or arm. My body, my choice argument is not a valid argument-scientifically. We need to be courageous and have this discussion in the public platform
3. **What about the woman that is raped?**
 - a) Many women have chosen to have the baby or place the baby for adoption.
 - b) Killing the baby after a traumatic rape just inflicts more trauma on a woman. Why would killing the innocent child be a valid option.
 - c) Statistic-The number of abortions due to rape is minuscule in MN and Nationally
4. **What about the woman that has an ectopic pregnancy?**

Ectopic pregnancy requires surgery and is a pregnancy that will not survive, it is in the fallopian tube. It is **a non-issue** that the abortion advocates have brought up since the Roe v Wade opinion. It is not an abortion; it is a medical procedure. Nothing has changed as to availability of this procedure
5. **What about if the women's life is in danger.**

There are over 30 doctors that testified before congress -stating that this is not an issue. **That they have never seen this situation where killing the child is necessary to save the mother's life.** An emergency C-section can be performed to save the mother's life (if there were such a situation) this also is a **non-argument.**
